<u>The Most Holy Trinity Sunday – June 7th, 2020</u>



The fundamental dogma, on which everything in Christianity is based, is that of the Blessed Trinity in whose name all Christians are baptized. The feast of the Blessed Trinity needs to be understood and celebrated as a prolongation of the mysteries of Christ and as the solemn expression of our faith in this triune life of the Divine Persons, to which we have been given access by

Baptism and by the Redemption won for us by Christ. Only in heaven shall we properly understand what it means, in union with Christ, to share as sons in the very life of God.

The feast of the Blessed Trinity was introduced in the ninth century and was only inserted in the general calendar of the Church in the fourteenth century by Pope John XXII. But the cultus of the Trinity is, of course, to be found throughout the liturgy. Constantly the Church causes us to praise and adore the thrice-holy God who has so shown His mercy towards us and has given us to share in His life.

The dogma of faith which forms the object of the feast is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. But I submit humbly and say: *Lord, I believe, help my weak faith*.

Why is this feast celebrated at this particular time? It may be interpreted as a finale to all the preceding feasts. All three Persons contributed to and shared in the work of redemption. The Father sent His Son to earth, for "God so loved the world as to give His only-begotten Son." The Father called us to the faith. The Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, became man and died for us. He redeemed us and made us children of God. He ever remains the liturgist *par excellence* to whom we are united in all sacred functions. After Christ's ascension the Holy Spirit, however, became our Teacher, our Leader, our Guide, our Consoler. On solemn occasions a thanksgiving *Te Deum* rises spontaneously from Christian hearts.

Symbols of the Trinity: Equilateral Triangle; Circle of Eternity; Three interwoven Circles; Triangle in Circle; Circle within Triangle; Interwoven Circle and Triangle; Two Triangles interwoven in shape of Star of David; Two Triangles in shape of Star of David interwoven with Circle; Shield of the Holy Trinity; Three Fishes linked together in shape of a triangle; Cross and Triangle overlapping; and St. Patrick's Shamrock.

Suggested Things to Do:

- Depending on the ages of family members, research symbols of the Trinity and create something for the centerpiece of your family table, or something for your family altar, such as a small banner or poster. It can be as little as a 4 x 6 photograph or something to use every year as a backdrop or wall hanging.
- Think of different foods to serve that can reflect the

- symbolism of the Trinity. One example is clover leaf rolls. These rolls are formed with three balls of dough put into one hole of the muffin tin for each roll. They are easy to make. Use your favorite roll recipe (you can even buy frozen bread or roll dough), or search on the Internet for one of many examples.
- <u>The Directory on Popular Piety</u> explains some of the pious exercises related to the devotion of the Holy or Blessed Trinity. Three very simple prayers are the Sign of the Cross, Glory be to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Corpus Christi Sunday

Next Sunday June 14th, we will be celebrating Corpus Christi Sunday or the Body and Blood of Christ Sunday. I plan to expose the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance after Mass and then do Benediction. After that, I will leave the Blessed Sacrament on the altar and people may adore and leave in silence at their own time.

In our traditional way of celebrating this Feast, we would do some outdoor procession, but we won't do that due to the virus situation.

The purpose of keeping this tradition is to remind ourselves the importance of Eucharist which is the center of our faith as expressed in Mass. You may consider to spend a quiet moment with the Lord and offer your intentions after Mass. That is a moment of special grace and God will listen to you and answer your prayers. We have a treasure within our church and let us make use of it. Taste and see that God is good in listening to us.

<u>Updates on the COVID-19 by DHMs as from June 1st</u>

The Department of Health and Human Services (DHMs) Phase II has made statewide changes as from June 1st:

- Only individuals returning from international travel will be required to quarantine for 14 days upon returning in Nebraska.
- The above restrictions do not apply to those returning from military or health care services abroad.
- Church gatherings remain limited to only 25 % of rated occupancy with maintenance of 6 feet separation from each party. We have been doing these and will continue.
- Wedding and Funeral Reception Venues: Will be limited to the greater of 25 people or 50% of rated occupancy, keeping 6 feet separation between parties with maximum of 6 people per party. Self-serve buffets and salad bars are prohibited. Venue staff will serve food directly to all individuals. No dances or other social events that require guests to gather outside of their respective tables are permitted.

This DHM does not change the previous DHM for churches, so our current status quo will remain after June 1st.

N/B: I would like to remind you to keep using facemasks when coming for Mass and use hand sanitizer before and after Mass.


