

<u>The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ,</u> <u>King of the Universe</u>

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, formerly referred to as "Christ the King," was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking and living and organizes his life as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking

and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

Today's Mass establishes the titles for Christ's royalty over men: 1) Christ is God, the Creator of the universe and hence wields a supreme power over all things; "All things were created by Him"; 2) Christ is our Redeemer, He purchased us by His precious Blood, and made us His property and possession; 3) Christ is Head of the Church, "holding in all things the primacy"; 4) God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as His special possession and dominion.

Today's Mass also describes the qualities of Christ's kingdom. This kingdom is: 1) supreme, extending not only to all people but also to their princes and kings; 2) universal, extending to all nations and to all places; 3) eternal, for "The Lord shall sit a King forever"; 4) spiritual, Christ's "kingdom is not of this world."

In ancient times, oriental monarchs visited their principalities (theophany), so the divine King appears in His city, the Church; from its sacred precincts. He casts His glance over all the world.... On the final feast of the Christmas cycle, the Presentation in the Temple, holy Church meets her royal Bridegroom with virginal love: "Adorn your bridal chamber, O Sion, and receive Christ your King!" The burden of the Christmas cycle may be summed up in these words: Christ the King establishes His Kingdom of light upon earth!

Adult Mass servers Needed!

I'm in need of adult volunteer Mass servers on Sundays and during Funeral Masses in Beemer and Wisner. I welcome any gender. This will be easy for people who ever served mass while young in those days but I welcome also new ones who want to learn to help just with the basics. We have enough vestments to use. All



volunteer Mass servers will wear masks during the Mass since we get so close to each other occasionally. Contact me if you are willing.

Let's Learn About Mass Corner: Why do we do that?

Penitential Rite, Gloria. All the other ritual acts of this first part of the Mass are intended to gather us together into a worshiping assembly. They are like introductory parts meant to prepare us for the real thing. Sometimes we are asked to pause and recall our common need for salvation (the Penitential Rite- this where we pause briefly when the priest ask that we recollect our sins before we continue with the Mass). This short penitential rite should not be taken as a replacement of confession. The sins forgiven here are usually venial (small sins". It is a way of reconciling with God before we enter into major communication with him. The is why the pause is usually brief. We will still need to go confession for mortal (deliberate with full knowledge) sins.

Sometimes the hymn "Glory to God in the Highest" is sung or recited at this point. The "Gloria" has been a part of the Mass since about the sixth century! These longer hymns and responses are found in the missalette at our seat. In week day Masses, we don't sing Gloria because it is low Mass (not a big celebration like Sunday or major Feast days). We also don't sing glory during Lent and advent because, we are usually in the mood of waiting for a big celebration as with Easter or Christmas. An easy way to understand is like we don't cut the main cake in a wedding celebration before the wedding couple arrives at the reception hall. We wait patiently and sometimes anxious to see the guest of honor.

Opening Prayer. At the close of this first part of the Mass the priest will ask us to join our minds in prayer, and after a few moments of silence he will collect our intentions into one prayer to which we all respond "Amen," a Hebrew word for "So be it." *Next week I will talk about part 2 on Story telling i.e.: the 3 readings, homily and the Universal prayers.*


