The 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time



Jesus said to his disciples: "In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory, and then he will send out the an-

gels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky (Mk 13:24-27)."

The **First Reading** is taken from the Book of Daniel 12:1-3. Today's reading puts before our eyes the fact that this world will have an end marked by great upheavals and disasters. However, these will be followed immediately by a new and everlasting existence.

The **Gospel** is from the Gospel of Mark 13:24-32. There are some obscurities in this extract from St. Mark. Firstly, because Christ was discussing and answering questions on two distinct topics: the destruction of the temple and the end of the world. Secondly, because we may not have a clear understanding of Christ here, as many exegetes suggest. The message we must learn from today's gospel comes across without any ambiguity or doubt: we must always be ready to face our judgement for we know not the day nor the hour when we will be called from this life. When or how this world will end is of no great importance to us; what is important is that we shall leave this world very soon and our eternity will depend on the state of our consciences at the moment of our departure.

<u>Today's Catechism – Let's learn something about our</u> Catholic Faith

Lesson 5: Public worship of God

What happens at Mass?

Bread and wine are changed into the body and blood of Christ and offered to God to renew the sacrifice Jesus offered upon the Cross.

Who offered the first Mass?

Jesus Christ on the last supper before he died offered the first Mass over 2000 years ago. (Mt. 26: 26 ...and while they were at supper, take and eat.... All of you drink of this...).

Did Jesus ever give this power of changing bread and wine to anyone else?

Yes, to his apostles. (Lk. 22:19 – Do this in remembrance of me...).

Did Jesus want his apostles to hand down this power to others?

Yes, because he wanted all people to participate actively in this sacrifice by offering it and sharing in it through communion of His Body and blood. (John 6: 54 - Unless you eat the flesh of the son of man and drink his blood, you shall not have life in you.).

How did the apostles hand down this power?

By making other men priests and bishops in what we call ordination.

Who has this power today?

The priests and bishops of the Catholic Church.

At what part of the Mass does the priest change bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ?

It is during the part called consecration in the middle of the Mass when he says: "This is my body...This is my blood...'

Today's reality:

Many of our Catholics do not understand some of the things that go on during Mass. Please take interest in Mass and ask where you don't understand. I will cover Mass details in lesson 22.
