The 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Gospel: Luke 18:9-14: Jesus addressed this parable: "Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity greedy, dishonest, adulterous—or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole

income.' But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.

One thing that we can learn from this sad story of the Pharisees is that, while God approves of no sin, His mercy and His forgiveness is available for all sinners except the proud. It isn't that God cannot or will not forgive the sin of pride but that the proud man will not ask for God's forgiveness.

A few simple straight questions can tell us whether or not we are proud. Do we like others to see and hear of our good works, or do we prefer to do them in secret? Do we give as generously to charitable causes when no list of benefactors is published? Do we willingly take part among the rank and file in parish activities or do we feel offended if we are not the leaders? Do we criticize offhand those who are not all they should be, or do we thank God that we were saved from similar temptations? Do we always try to find an excuse for the failings of others or have we excuses for our own faults only. If anyone recognizes that he is, let him pray to God from the bottom of his heart for the opposite virtue, the true Christian virtue of humility, and look for every possible occasion to practice it.

Lesson 14: Jesus Christ, Our Savior

John 3:16-17 "For God so loved the world that He sent his only begotten son that those who believe in him may not perish but may have everlasting life. For God did not send his son to judge the world but that the world might be saved through Him."

Did Mary have any children besides Jesus? No, she and Joseph lived as brother sister although they were married. In Luke 1:26 we read: "The angel Gabriel was sent from God....to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph....and the virgin's name was Mary..." May be Mary and Joseph were waiting to con-validate their marriage before the angel appeared.

When was Jesus born and where did he grow up? He was born nearly 2000 years a go and raised in the village of Nazareth until he was 30 years old.


How did Jesus spend the last years of his life? He preached God's love and forgiveness, worked miracles and established His church.
