The 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time



The **First Reading** is taken from the Second Book of Maccabees 7:1-2. 9-14 and recounts the story of the seven brothers and their mother who were arrested and put to death because they would not abandon their religion.

The Gospel is from St. Luke 20:27-38. We can thank the Sadducees today. They came to our Lord with what they thought was a case that would make the doc-

trine of resurrection look very ridiculous. It would have appeared so, if it were understood in the crude sense which they gave it, namely, that we would come forth again from the grave in the very same bodies which we now have, with all their needs and instincts. Our Lord corrected that erroneous idea. We shall all rise to a new and eternal life, in a form and an existence very different from that of our present life. Thus, the question of ownership of wives or property will not, and cannot, arise in our new life. He gave us a brief but basic description of what our risen bodies will be. I am sure that most of us would love to know a lot more about what our future state will be like. But if we knew all, then where would our faith and trust in God come in? Some saints are said to have had brief visions of the joys of heaven. They wanted to die immediately to get there. God wants each one of us to [attain] heaven, by living our life on earth, and trusting in His word that heaven will be our eternal home if we do our part here below.

Let each one of us investigate our own conscience this morning. Let us ask ourselves, how we would fare if death should claim us tonight. If there are sins on my conscience, which I would not want there when facing my just Judge, I still have time to approach the merciful Father. The Christian who does this daily, or even weekly, will not worry when death calls. He can rest assured that it is the beginning of the true and everlasting life, planned for him by God before time being.

November – The month of remembering those in **Purgatory**

Each one of us has lost someone so dear to him or her. It may be a close family member, a relative or friend. We believe that heaven is a place for only the pure hearted. But there are people who tried to



live a virtuous life, practiced their faith but due to human weaknesses, they committed sin like we all do. They are not bad people to go to hell and neither pure clean of sin to go to heaven. So we believe that there is a place for these souls to await purification before they are accepted into heaven. That place is what the church calls purgatory. While there, they only rely on our prayers for their salvation. We don't know how long they be there, that all depends on God's mercy. That is why in every Mass, we pray for the dead and crown it all. We pray for all these people during this month of November.

I ask you to consider taking an envelope from the church and schedule a for Mass of your beloved one. That is the only gift you can give to the one you love who has died. You can also dedicate any form of prayers like the rosary to the people you want to pray for. Be sure to mention their names in every decade.

If we all flood heaven with our cries of prayers of the dead to the throne of God, I believe God will listen to us and open the gates of heaven to our loved ones in purga-

<u>Today's Catechism – Let's learn something about our</u> Catholic Faith

What are Indulgences?

Indulgences are favors we receive from God for our good works. They are mainly dedicated to our beloved dead. Common sense tells us that our God will have mercy on us and will listen to us even though we are sinful but do some good works especially for ourselves and others who have died. These remissions of punishment God grants to the living by his own direct power; but He nearly always approves of and permits their application to the dead as well.

There is full indulgence which we call "Plenary" and part indulgence which we call "Partial". A partial indulgence can be obtained by devoutly visiting a cemetery and praying for the departed, even if the prayer is only mental. One can gain a plenary indulgence visiting a cemetery each day between November 1 and November 8. These indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory.

A plenary indulgence is also granted when the faithful piously visit a church or place of prayer on November 2. In visiting the church or chapel, you are deliberately offering plenary indulgence to the souls of the dead.
