The 2nd Sunday of Advent



"As the journey of Advent continues, as we prepare to celebrate the nativity of Christ, John the Baptist's call to conversion sounds out in our communities. It is a pressing invitation to open our hearts and to welcome the Son of God Who comes among us to make divine judgement manifest. The Father, writes St. John the Evangelist, does not judge anyone, but has entrusted the power of

judgement to the Son, because He is the Son of man.

"And it is today, in the present, that we decide our future destiny. It is with our concrete everyday behavior in this life that we determine our eternal fate. At the end of our days on earth, at the moment of death, we will be evaluated on the basis of our likeness or otherwise to the Baby Who is about to be born in the poor grotto of Bethlehem, because He is the measure God has given humanity.

"Through the Gospel John the Baptist continues to speak down the centuries to each generation. His hard clear words bring health to us, the men and women of this day in which even the experience and perception of Christmas often, unfortunately, reflects materialist attitudes. The 'voice' of the great prophet asks us to prepare the way for the coming Lord in the deserts of today, internal and external deserts, thirsting for the water of life which is Christ." — Benedict XVI

The **Gospel** is from the *Gospel of Matthew 3:1-12*, an angel announced to Zechariah, a priest of the temple, that he would have a son (even though his wife Elizabeth was barren and advanced in years). This son was destined to be the Precursor who would announce the proximate arrival of the long-expected Messiah. John, the name given him by the angel even before his conception, spent his youth and early manhood as a hermit in the desert of Judea, preparing himself for his exalted office. When God revealed to him that the Messiah was soon to begin his public life, John set out for the bank of the Jordan, where he began to preach repentance, in order to prepare the people for "him who was to come."

In this holy season of Advent, as we prepare to welcome Christ at Christmas. John the Baptist has words of advice and warnings for each one of us. He advises us to "prepare the way of the Lord," by true repentance of our past sins and a firm resolution to straighten "the ways of the Lord," that is, not to deviate from the true Christian way of life in the future.

Lesson: 17: The Key to Unity in the Church

What did Jesus do to make sure that his church is united? He sent the Holy Spirit to dwell in his body the church, uniting the members with one another and with Himself.

Who is the chief instrument of the Holy Spirit's teaching and unifying work in the church? It is the Pope who is the vicar of Christ and bishop of Rome.

When did Jesus make Peter the first pope? Shortly before he ascended into heaven. (Mt. 16:18-19).

Did Peter's authority die with him? No, it was handed down to a man named Linus, and after he died, it was handed down to another and so on during the past 2000 years.

Did Jesus require us to follow the pope in matters of faith and morals? Yes, because obedience and loyalty to the pope are among the chief requirements of our Lord's plan for unity in his church.

Can the pope make an error when teaching doctrines or morals? Not when he is speaking solemnly (ex-cathedra) as head of the church. He has that special protection from error which God gives as spiritual safeguard.

Today's reality: The Holy Spirit is still present in our church today and assigns us different gifts. It is this spirit that has united catholic church for the last 2,000 years.

Someone asked me recently if there is any college of bishops, cardinals and popes. There isn't any. Bishops are appointed from ordinary priests. From bishops, archbishops are appointed and from them, cardinals are appointed. Then the pope is elected by cardinals from the college of cardinals. Every cardinal is a candidate of becoming a pope. Since there is no training for bishops, archbishops, cardinals and the pope, once they are elevated, they go to Rome to meet the pope personally and attend a short inservice training with regard to their duties and mostly it takes one week. The newly appointed pope attends his session by himself
