The 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time Bulletin



The First Reading is taken from the Second Book of Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a. The account of Elisha and the woman was a minor incident in the life of this prophet, who worked greater miracles, but it is narrated to show that God rewards those who are charitable to his friends.

The **Gospel** is from *St*. Matthew 10:37-42. In the first

part, Christ tells his representatives, his delegates the Apostles, and those who succeed them, that they must be prepared to undergo great sacrifices, even death itself, if called on to do so for the sake of Christ. Even though they had only a very vague idea then of what he meant, when the time came, they remembered his words and gladly suffered imprisonment, hardships, and finally martyrdom for Christ. This shows how the resurrection of Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit on them, changed them from worldly weaklings into fearless heroes. They had become convinced that Christ was the Son of God who had come on earth to bring all men to heaven. They came to realize how transitory, and unimportant; the few years of earthly life were when compared with the eternal life of bliss to follow.

It was not only the Apostles who gave their lives gladly for Christ. There are thousands of martyrs who, during the first three centuries of the Church, not only accepted but welcomed death for Christ's sake, because they were convinced that it was the door to eternal life, the only life that mattered. Nor did occasions for martyrdom cease when the Church was granted freedom by Constantine, the first convert Roman emperor. Here and there, down through the centuries, the followers of Christ have been persecuted because of their belief in him, and many of us can be proud that we have had among our ancestors' men and women who died for the faith.

Today, too, there are still those who are suffering a lingering martyrdom, worse than quick death on the scaffold, because they obey God rather than man. We can help them to persevere, by our prayers. We ourselves, who are free from any overt persecution, must show our gratitude to God for being allowed to practice our religion openly and without fear, by doing just this. We must live according to the convictions of our Christian faith. We are here in this world for a few short years, our real and lasting home is in heaven. We must keep this thought uppermost in our minds, in all our doings and dealings.








From Fr. Vincent's Desk:

PRIEST ASSIGNMENTS—The three priests of our family, Fr Walter Jong-A-Kiem, Fr Vincent Sunguti, and I, will have primary parishes which will be our focus, but will also rotate where we offer some weekend Masses. Fr Walter will live in Dodge and be the primary contact for the HWY 91 parishes in Dodge, Howells, and Olean. Fr Vincent will continue to live in Wisner and be administrator of the HWY 275 parishes in Wisner and Beemer. I will continue to live in West Point and be the primary contact for the HWY 32 parishes in West Point, St Charles, Monterey, and Aloys. There will not be a new associate moving to West Point to replace Fr Matt N.

In regard to rotating where we offer weekend Masses, Fr Walter and I will rotate on the 2nd weekend of the month so that Fr Walter will be in West Point and Aloys while I will go to Dodge and Howells. Fr Vincent and I will rotate on the 4th weekend of the month so that Fr Vincent will be in West Point and Aloys and I will be in Wisner, Beemer, and St Anthony/St Boniface. As a clarification, the priest who has Mass in Wisner in Beemer on Sunday will also have Mass at St Anthony/St Boniface on Saturday. Fr Vincent and Fr Walter will rotate when there is a 5th weekend. When in comes to weekday Masses, the primary priest of the particular parishes will offer those.

My hope is that this arrangement, on one hand, will give you a sense a stability having a primary priest to build a relationship and turn to. On the other hand, the rotation allows us priests to get to all the parishes and for you to at least have an experience with each of us.
