The 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time



The **Gospel** is from *St. Mat-thew 9:36, 10:8.* "Jesus had compassion for them." Who were the "crowds" on whom he had compassion? Among them were tax-collectors who cheated, robbers who robbed, murderers who murdered, harlots who lived lives of unchastity, adulterers who violated their marriage vows, nominal believers in God who never went to the temple or honored

God in private. These may have been a minority, but there was no town or district in Palestine of that time in which some, or all such sinners, could not be found. Yet Jesus, who read their innermost minds, had pity on them for he saw that most, if not all of these sinners, acted through ignorance and through lack of instruction. They were lost sheep because they had no shepherd to lead them. The exalted opinion of their own sanctity that their official teachers had, caused them to shun the people, lest they be contaminated.

Christ said the harvest of such poor, misguided souls was plentiful and he needed more harvesters. That, indeed, was true in his day, but it is a hundred percent truer today. Any of our modern larger cities today has a population greater than the whole of Palestine in Christ's day. And the percentage of sinners in these cities would be greater, not less, than the percentage of sinners then in Palestine.

Christ too is unchanged. He still has compassion for today's sinners and wants them to be saved, not lost. But for this he needs "harvesters," apostles, who will help him. Here is where all good Christians, all who really love God and their neighbor, must help. The harvest is plentiful; indeed, it is huge. But let not its huge size frighten us. If everyone reaps his own corner, we shall all meet in the center of the harvest-field someday.

For many years priests have been preparing marriage couples in our parishes since we are trained, but due to more work that we have now, lay couples need to step up and train too so that they can help me in preparing couples for marriage. This training will also be helpful to you as a married couple. It will strengthen your relationship even more.

THE NEW WEEKEND MASS SCHEDULE will begin July 1 and is in part based on the Archdiocesan parameter of each priest being able to offer Mass at 3 locations. Because of this parameter, Sacred Heart in Olean and Holy Trinity in Heun will cease to have a weekend Mass. Hence, some of those parishioners will most likely attend Mass in Howells or Dodge. With this in mind and looking at current weekend Mass attendance and church capacity, it necessitates that West Point and Howells have two weekend Masses. St Wenceslaus in Dodge has a large enough capacity to accommodate any influx of people from surrounding parishes with one Mass. SPIRITUAL INSIGHT—Even when your upset or frustrated (in this case about Mass schedules), it's amazing at how a coincidence or in this case Godinstance can make you laugh (most likely is disbelief). We have been preparing for and talking about these Mass time changes for several months and now it is upon us. The main reason for these changes is because of the declining number of priests. Wouldn't you know that in the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus instructs his disciples to "ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." It made me laugh because it's like, we've been praying for vocations, are you going to answer? But it's about more than just praying for vocations to the priesthood. The fact that we still have a declining number of priests should help one recognize that the laborers for the harvest aren't specifically a reference to priests, but is a reference to all the baptized. Every Christian has a role to play in the Church. Each one of us is called to be a laborer of the harvest. Thus, praying for more priests is one thing, but one should also ask, "Am I following God's will in the vocation to which He has called me? How am I laboring to further the mission of the Church?"
