## The 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Gospel is from St. Matthew 16:13-20. Today's reading from St. Matthew tells us how Christ provided for this necessity. In making Peter the head of the Apostolic College, the foundationstone of his Church, the guarantor of its stability in the symbol of the keys and the promise that all his decisions would be ratified in heaven, Christ gave him the power of freedom from error

when officially teaching the universal Church.

In other words, Peter received the primacy in the Church and the gift of infallibility in his official teaching on matters of faith and morals. As the Church was to continue long after Peter had died, it was rightly understood from the beginning that the privileges given to him and which were necessary for the successful mission of the Church, were given to his lawful successors-the Popes.

This has been the constant belief in the Church from its very beginning. The first Vatican Council solemnly defined this dogma and it was reconfirmed recently in the second Vatican Council. In giving these powers to Peter and to his lawful successors Christ was planning for our needs. In order to preserve and safeguard the right conduct of all its members He provided a central seat of authoritative power in His Church. Through the gift of infallibility, He assured us that whatever we were commanded to believe (faith) or to do (morals) would always be what He and his heavenly Father wanted us to believe and to do.

How can we ever thank Christ for these marvelous gifts to his Church, that is, to us? Let us say a fervent: "thank you, Lord; You have foreseen all our needs and provided for them, grant us the grace to do the little part you ask of us in order to continue our progress on the one direct road to heaven.'

From Fr. Vincent's Desk: Just for Today: Identifying and Naming our Feelings in Prayer

When we go for medical help with



a pain, most of the time we are asked to rate our pain. We might be given a scale of 5 or 10 or use of words such as mild, painful, very painful, or seriously painful and so forth to describe one's pain. It is through such naming of how we feel that determines how we can receive treatment.

Similar thing also happen in our spiritual relationship with God. How we feel and what is going on in our lives affects our relationship with God. We may as well keep quiet about our feelings. If they are good ones, then we long to stay in that situation for a long time, but then it goes away. And if feeling bad, we hope it to go away but it doesn't.

In prayer, naming our feelings is very important. Tell God how you are feeling and let him know. You may do some journaling if you are comfortable with that. Tell God how you got there, what happened and if they are good feelings, thank Him and any other persons. If bad feelings, ask for his help and state where you would like to be or how you would like to feel and ask him to accompany you as you also think of how you will get where you want to be.

St. Ignatius talks about moments of consolation and moments of desolation. By consolation, Ignatius is referring to feeling happy, joyful, grateful, victorious, and even restful. Desolation for him means experiencing pain, sadness, loneliness, anger, anxiousness and even being tired. He goes on by stating that when we are in consolation, we are moving towards God and when we are in desolation, we move away from God. Every time we go through moments of consolation, our desire and prayer is that we stay there for long if not forever. Unfortunately, it comes and goes but the good news is that it will come back. When we experience desolation, know that consolation will be coming. We cause some of these experiences of life, others simply come naturally as part of the nature of the life which we live. God desires that we all experience moments of consolation forever since it is a glimpse of heaven, but we experience desolation because we are weak and continue to live in a weak world.

Take time to share with God the good or bad that is going on in your life. He wants to hear it from you since the solution will come partly from Him, me and you too.
