

We will be starting CCD classes this Wednesday. We thank all the volunteer catechists who have come to help and enable this program to kick off on this new



year of 2023-2024. I ask the parents to ensure their children attend classes every Wednesday. In the past year, we had a sluggish turnout of the high school juniors and seniors. Hopefully this year they will make use of this one day per week to learn something about their faith.

I usually try to visit each class on Wednesday for a few minutes to answer the student's questions or share something brief. I always start with the question of knowing what they learned in the previous Sunday during Mass. Unfortunately, the answers are usually not good. Most of them don't show up for Sunday Mass and so it is tricky for them to answer me. When I ask them why they didn't attend Mass, most of the answers are based on the decisions of the parents and not children. If you choose to bring your child for CCD, ensure that you reinforce what they learn by bringing them on Sunday. Most of the things they learn, are practically done or seen on Sunday during Mass. You will be helping your child in a big way if you value Sunday Mass. If you really mind your child's faith and would like to instill in them some good Catholic Christian faith and morals, help them to know that attending Mass on the day of the Lord is not an option but a requirement.

I know some of the parents really try. They not only come to Sunday Mass with their kids but they teach them at home how to pray, what to pray, names of things in the church, how to behave while in the church, among other faith related knowledge. These students who are supported by parents do very well in CCD and even serving at Mass. They are also very enthusiastic to learn their faith. Practice makes perfect. You and me who grew up in Catholic faith I am sure your parents were supportive to you and played a big role in your faith formation. So, parents, let us not leave this responsibility to the CCD teachers and me only. Let's support them and you will see good results. The good seeds of faith that you plant in your child when he or she is still young, will grow with them and will never go away. They can make their own decisions later on in life but they do still have our good Catholic conscience at the back of their minds. Together we can make this happen!
