## The 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Gospel is from St. Matthew 18:21-35. On reading or hearing this story of the merciless servant, each one of us would rightly judge him a mean, low type of man, a heartless man, who puts himself outside the pale of mercy. He throttled his fellow-servant for a paltry debt of ten dollars, and would not listen to the poor man's plea for mercy.

When we hear what the king did to this heartless servant we heartily approve and say: "It served him right, he got what he richly deserved."

That day has not yet come for us. We still have time to put our affairs in order. We still can forgive all our enemies from our heart. If we do not, we are cutting ourselves off from the possibility of having our own sins and offenses forgiven by God. We have the solemn word of our divine Lord for this in the lesson he draws from the parable "So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you (that is, deliver us up to eternal slavery) if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."

Our Catholic church has so much that we can tap in for our spiritual and even phys-


ical renewal. Mass in our catholic church is the most important resource among many others. We are lucky to have Mass here weekly if not daily. Protestants call this ritual service and for Catholics, it is called Mass. What is the difference? The difference is found in the meaning of the ritual and the person who leads. For Protestant, this ritual is just a prayer session that sometimes is organized and other times it is simultaneous. It is led by a church minister or any member can offer it too. Mass for Catholics is a solemn ritual that is offered as a sacrifice. It is only offered by a priest. Therefore, Mass has something to do with sacrifice.

The priest in the Mass takes the role of Christ and leads the sacrifice on behalf of the assembly that is present. The climax of this offertory is during consecration when he invokes the power of the Holy Spirit to come down and change the species of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ. I just want to let you know that this part of the Mass called consecration is the healing session. The Holy spirit who comes down does not only remain on the altar of sacrifice but also comes to us members present to heal us from our infirmities. If you really believe in the power of consecration, I ask you to make use of this powerful part of the Mass to invite Jesus into the dark area of your life that needs help. It takes so much faith and focus on what is happening on the altar right from the beginning of the Mass. Do not miss Mass especially on Sunday which is an opportunity for you and me to encounter Jesus in his true presence through the Eucharist.
