

### The 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time



The First Reading is taken from the Book of Wisdom 6:12-16 and cites watchfulness as the key to a faithful religion and understanding of wisdom.

The **Gospel** is from *St. Mat*thew 25:1-13. Although commentators and writers have found difficulty in explaining many of the details in this parable, the general lesson is clear enough. Our Lord described

an incident that happened or could have happened at a wedding festival in order to bring home to his listeners the need for being ever vigilant and ready in his service if they wish to avoid the calamity of being excluded from the heavenly and eternal nuptials on the last day. In the other parable in which our Lord uses a wedding feast to describe his kingdom, the lesson concerns those who refused the invitation and will not come to the wedding. Here it concerns those who gladly accepted the invitation.

### Sunday Reflection

The bridegroom could come any moment to meet his bride as we see in the Gospel. The foolish virgins had no oil in their lamps but the wise virgins did. Why is that so important? The lamps represent our faith and the oil our good works. Jesus is showing us that faith without works is dead. He did not recognize the foolish virgins who wanted to borrow oil from the wise virgins. We cannot borrow the good works from others or their holy character to make it to heaven. Jesus is calling us to a deep personal relationship with Him on earth. If we are deeply loved by Him in our personal prayer life, we want to love Him back by acts of charity. We can love Jesus back by our corporal works of mercy: we feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the prisoners, bury the dead, and give alms to the poor. We can also perform spiritual works of mercy by counseling the doubtful, instructing the ignorant, admonishing the sinner, comforting the sorrowful, forgiving injuries, bearing wrongs patiently, and by praying for the living and the dead. When we are merciful, we imitate Jesus and can expect a merciful judge to receive us when we die. When we lack mercy and don't help others out, we will hear 'Amen, I say to you, I do not know you." That is a very hard saying. Jesus calls us all to ask for more of His Holy Spirit, His divine love, to fill our hearts with overflowing love. Then we can more readily share His love in acts of charity. This is possible if we have a vibrant prayer life. Come Holy Spirit and give me the gift of deep prayer.
