The Gospel is from St. Mark 4:26 -34. One of the proofs of the divine origin of the Church of Christ is its growth from very humble beginnings. "Recently, a third abortion-related ballot initiative was launched. This effort, under the name Choose Life Now, seeks to provide protection in the state constitution for unborn children from the moment of conception.
