The scribes and the Pharisees disregard God's commandments and cling instead to their own selfrighteousness and sense of superiority. Since their hearts are far from God, evils like greed, malice, deceit, and arrogance come "from their hearts." Like the scribes and Pharisees, how often do we let our own ego, which can be the greatest distance from our hearts spiritually, get in the way of doing what we ought or listening to what another has to say? We might think my way is better or what does the other know about this particular subject? However, we are called from this type of thinking to something greater. Are we humble enough to understand that God endows us with "statutes and decrees" in order to rescue us from our own fallen tendencies and to give us a way to "live, enter in, and take possession of the land" - which for us is the land of eternal life? By allowing our hearts to be formed by God's commandments, we "give evidence of our wisdom and intelligence to the nations." For such obedience reveals just how close to us is the God who "wills to give us birth by the word of truth" (excerpts taken from Magnificat, September 2024).


