September 22, 2024 - 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." MARK 9:35 Jesus teaches us that we are called to love one another. Love involves sacrifice. Sacrifice is a word that many of us don't like to hear. We think it means that we must give up something that we want. However, the literal meaning of sacrifice is "to make holy," from the words "sacer" = sacred and "facere" = to make. In other words, when we sacrifice, we make our lives holy by sharing our gifts in the service of God.



SPIRITUAL INSIGHT—from Fr. Walter

The disciples want to be first, the greatest of all. Jesus tells them "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." That is quite the opposite of what they thought. Oh no I have so much to grow. Don't we all. St. Augustine tells us that "humility is the foundation of all virtues; therefore, in a soul where it does not exist there can be no true virtue, but the mere appearance only. In like manner, it is the most proper disposition for all celestial gifts. And, final, it is so necessary to perfection, that of all the ways to reach it, the first is humility; the second humility; the third, humility." Jesus comes against the root of all sin that is the capital sin of pride. The Word of God, descends and descends and takes on our human nature that is weak and in which Jesus can suffer the utmost humiliation on the cross. There He shows us that as the least of all He is the Servant of servants and serves up His life as the ransom for our sins in total obedience and love to His Father. As His beloved Son He takes away the disobedience of pride in us that seeks its own will and decides what is right and wrong. But hasn't God already told us what is right and wrong in the 10 commandments and the Bible and placed His law in our hearts? Thus, Jesus calls us to be driven by love, the Holy Spirit, for He calls us to pray daily for a humble heart that seeks to do God's will, to descend daily, and to serve.


