



"It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." (MARK 10:25) Jesus uses tough language that we may not want to hear. However, we are all called to be generous with all of our gifts. Not just the ones we pick and choose, but all our gifts, and especially the one that means the most to us! That includes our time in prayer to God, our talent in participating in parish ministries and our treasure supporting our local parish and other charities.

SPIRITUAL INSIGHT— Fr. Walter

"It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." The eye of a needle is very small; a camel is big. When Jesus shows us that it is impossible for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle we pay attention. It is so easy for us to love what Jesus has created. He placed His wisdom and beauty in all that He has made; we can see His handprints of creative love in nature, our dogs, cats, trees, spouses, kids, yes even your annoying brother and sister is made by the love flowing out of the Heart of Jesus. But with the beauty of creation comes a tendency to love what God created more than God. That is what St. Augustine talks about: "Too late have I loved you, O Beauty so ancient, O Beauty so new. Too late have I loved you! You were within me but I was outside myself, and there I sought you! In my weakness, I ran after the beauty of the things you have made. You were with me, and I was not with you." We can become greedy with our time and get lost with our toys, three-hour baseball and football games, long talks with friends and forget all about Jesus Who is the most important Person in our lives. We can give Jesus just left over time and not the best time of the day. The rich young man did not want to leave all for Jesus; he went away sad because he was attached to his possessions. Jesus calls us to be more generous with our time spent in prayer to listen more and talk more to Him. He calls us to love Him more than what He created; to love the Source of all beauty, goodness, love, kindness above all because when we have Him we have everything.
