"I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they all contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, her whole living." (MARK 12:43-44) Jesus gets right to the point – we are all called to give money to support the mission of the Church, regardless of our circumstance. No gift is too small or insignificant! Giving money to support the mission of our local parish is a matter of our faith, just like praying and participating in parish ministries. When you make a financial offering, is it from your "first fruits" or from what is "left over"?



SPIRITUAL INSIGHT— from Fr. Walter

SPIRITUAL INSIGHT from Fr. Walter St. Paul of the Cross says: "Entrust yourself entirely to God. He is a Father and a most loving Father at that, Who would rather let heaven and earth collapse than abandon anyone who trusted in Him." St. Alphonsus Liguori states: "He who trusts in himself is lost. He who trusts in God can do all things." That says vol-umes doesn't it? Adam and Eve fell and trusted totally in themselves but Jesus comes and trusted totally in God. We usually fall in between on this scale; as we grow in our spiritual life, we move from trusting in ourselves to trusting in God even more till we arrive at that total trust in Him. That is a lifelong process to grow in trust: "Jesus I trust in You" the Divine Mercy chaplet teaches us. Elijah challenged the widow at Zarephath to trust God even more by asking her to first prepare a cake for him made up of flour and oil, and then for her son and herself. God rewarded her trust in Him through His prophet: she was able to eat for a year, the jar of flour and oil did not go empty. How generous is our God to reward such trust in Him by a miracle of love. The widow in the Gospel gave everything she had, her whole livelihood she put into the treasury. That is the type of trust we marvel about and we see all the time in Jesus and Mary. She must have experienced that living in total trust in God is where the Father takes good care of her better than her taking care of herself. It is a divine loving care revealed to a trusting child in awe of such a heavenly caring Father Who performs miracles of love.
