Dear brothers and sisters,

We have reached the 3rd Sunday of Advent also called Gaudete Sunday or Rejoice Sunday. And as we light the rose-colored candle on the Advent wreath, our hearts are invited to shift their focus toward joy. Yet, as we look around at the state of the world, finding reasons to rejoice can sometimes feel like a daunting task. Natural disasters wreak havoc on communities, leaving countless lives in disarray. Wars and acts of violence carve deep scars into nations and communities. Injustice, hatred, systemic racism, and political discord loom large, casting shadows over our collective hope. In the face of such overwhelming brokenness, it is only human to question: What is there to rejoice about? How do we embrace joy when suffering seems to overshadow everything? The answer lies in the profound gift of salvation through Jesus Christ. His coming brings light into our darkness, offering us new hope, renewed joy, and a transformative call to live in communion with one another. From His incarnation-God entering human history— to His quiet yet powerful presence in our everyday lives, and to the long -anticipated promise of His second coming, Jesus is the source of hope in a world longing for redemp-
