

SPIRITUAL INSIGHT— From Fr. Weeder

Today we continue our Christmas contemplation beholding the Holy Family, now twelve years removed from the scene in Bethlehem. We continue in the spirit of Christmas, which is to pause and wonder before the mystery of the birth of Our Lord. With Luke's guidance, we are brought to the Temple at a point in time when the Lord Jesus was twelve years of age. In this episode, Mary and Joseph "lose Jesus" for a time. As Christians, we may also feel like we have "lost Jesus." Today, we are tasked with renewing our search for Jesus. This is to seek out God and his will and Kingdom in our personal lives. While Joseph and Mary lost Jesus for a time, they also are the ideal for every Catholic family to look up to! They retrace their steps and find Jesus in His Father's house. While they didn't fully understand at the time what this meant, they pondered it and would come to know what Jesus' divinity meant as He continued to reveal Himself to them over the years. In the same way, Jesus reveals himself to us, especially through prayer, even in times when we feel we lost Him. This revelation begins in the family where parents first teach their children about faith.

While this might seem like a big task, it can start simply with prayer. Following are three easy steps to begin to introduce prayer into your family routine: Model Prayer: The first step is to model prayer yourself. You and your spouse should let your children see you praying regularly. This could be during mealtimes, before bed, or at specific times during the day. Your example will show them that prayer is a normal part of life.

Teach Them About Prayer: Explain to your children what prayer is. Sometimes reading stories of the lives of the saints can help to give kids a model to follow. You can tell them that prayer is a way to talk to God, thank Him for His blessings at the end of the day, ask Him for help, and to pray for others.

Pray Together: Start a routine of praying together as a family. Starting with bedtime prayers is easiest because the kids are calmer and always want to spend time with their parents to delay going to sleep! Also, before meals, or a once-a-week moment all together. If you pray the rosary, you might just start with one decade. Encourage each family member to take turns leading the prayer. This will give your children the opportunity to practice praying out loud and will help them become comfortable with it.

These simple steps are the beginning of sharing the faith which helps us find Jesus, especially when it seems we've lost Him.
