"And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value..." (PHILIPPIANS 1:9-10 During the Christmas shopping season it is easy to get caught up in the frenzy of buying gifts. But, is that "gift" truly an expression of your love for the other person. Or, are you just fulfilling your "obligation" to give them something? To grow in friendship with someone, you need to spend time with them and learn what is of value to them. Maybe this year, buy less "stuff" and spend more time with those you love.

SPIRITUAL INSIGHT— by Fr Walter

John the Baptist proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. He prepares us for the coming of the Lord this Advent season in a new way. Why is this so important in our lives? St. Alphonsus Liguori reminds us: We have only one evil to fear, and that is sin. Too often society promotes being sinful as being virtues. Isaiah 5:20 warns us: Woe to those who call evil good and good evil who put darkness for light and light for darkness, who put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter. Too often we see those who call the prideful who accomplish great things in the world as our heroes and those who stand up for the ten commandments as pests, old fashioned folks who have no idea what the majority wants, total freedom to do whatever they want to. But didn't Jesus teach us in the Our Father Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. In other words, God gave us a free will but a will that seeks total freedom to sin leads to darkness, the loss of eternal life and one that seeks God's will lead to true freedom, heaven. John the Baptist sought God's will to live in the desert and to lead people to Jesus to show that doing His will no matter how demanding at times leads to true freedom, divine peace, love, joy, heaven on earth and eternal life. Our biggest enemy is indeed sin, to do my will that opposes God's will and may lead to the loss of eternal life if we don't repent. But His mercy endures forever and He has conquered sin and death. All we need to do is to repent and turn to Him to receive His most holy mercy that saves us. Let us return to the sacrament of reconciliation at least monthly, especially this Advent to encounter a most tender, loving, and merciful Jesus Who restores us to new life.
