

#### Prayer to St. Joseph, Explained

For centuries, Christians have relied on the intercessory prayers of Joseph, earthly spouse of the Blessed Virgin and foster father of Christ, who was obedient to the will of God in all things.

One particular novena prayer to St. Joseph is often called "the unfailing prayer to St. Joseph." It is thought to have originated in the first century A.D. and was sent by the pope to Emperor Charles as he went into battle. It is said that those who recite this prayer will not suffer a sudden death and will likewise be protected from drowning, the effects of poison and fire, falling into the hands of the enemy or being overpowered in battle.



#### SPIRITUAL INSIGHT— from Fr. Weeder

Today, we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord. An ancient tradition in the Church is to bless holy candles and hold them in the Church during Mass. They symbolize Christ coming into the Temple. And thus, over time, today's feast became the Mass of Candles, or "Candlemas", reminding us that Christ is the light of the world.

When adults are baptized, they receive a candle which is lit from the Paschal/Easter Candle. After receiving the candle, the celebrant says:

You have been enlightened by Christ, Walk always as a child of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in your heart. When the Lord comes, may you go out to meet Him with all the Saints in the heavenly court.

What profound meaning in this statement. It's not simply an acknowledgement that one has received the light of Christ, but is also a command to live what one has received, faith in Jesus Christ. It is a faith that is not a one-time event, but it is a faith that needs to be fostered through continual reception of the sacraments, prayer, study, and reflection of Scripture. If one stops doing these things it is easy for the light to grow dim. However, it can begin burning brightly by returning to them, especially with the sacrament of reconciliation. I encourage you, to take some time this week and reflect upon how brightly is the light of Christ burning in your life?
