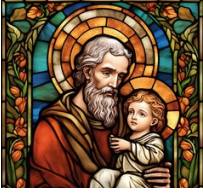

"To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given
for some benefit." 1 CORINTHIANS 12:7 St. Paul tells us

plan? How are you helping to build God's kingdom here
on earth? Remember that if you don't do the work God

has intended for you. Take time to discern your charisms
(gifts from the Holy Spirit). Experience the supernatural
Peace and Joy God desires for each of us.



SPIRITUAL INSIGHT—

Brothers and sisters,

We are back in Ordinary Time—a season
marked by the quiet rhythms of daily life, yet rich
with opportunities for spiritual growth. Unlike the
heightened seasons of Advent, Christmas, or Lent,
Ordinary Time gently calls us to focus on the
steady, continuous work of God in both the world
around us and within our own hearts.

In today's readings, we see just how true this
is. Whether it is the promise of restoration in Isaiah,
the abundance of grace at Cana, the diversity of
spiritual gifts in 1 Corinthians 12:4-11, or the call to
worship in Psalm 96, the message is clear: God is
constantly working to renew, uplift, and sanctify us.
He sees beyond our brokenness and assures us
that no part of our lives is too ordinary, mundane, or
lost for His transforming touch.

So, as we settle into Ordinary Time, let us
allow God to work in the simplicity of our days. Let
us surrender our time, our relationships, our daily
tasks, and our love to Him, trusting that He is pre-
sent even in the seemingly insignificant details of
our lives. And just as the ordinary water at Cana
was transformed into fine wine, so too can our
lives—when placed in His hands—become a reflec-
tion of His grace, love, and transforming power.
