

"Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared..." - NEHEMIAH 8:10 Ezra's instructions to the people show us that God does not forbid us from enjoying the good things in life. He wants us to be happy! However, God expects us to be grateful for all that He has given us and to generously share our blessings with those who are in need. Now here's the hard part – to share all we have without expecting anything in return.

SPIRITUAL INSIGHT— from Fr. Matthias Sule

Reflection of the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time:

What I like about the readings today is that they draw a sharp contrast between the Old and New Testaments. The focus of the Old Testament was very much God revealing the laws to his people. The New Testament is filled with a message that is different from the Law; it is the message of the Spirit. In the Old Testament, God gives us the law. In the New Testament, God gives us the Spirit. It's not a case of the spirit taking away the Law or even ignoring it. The two work together in a very interesting way. We could say that the Old Testament is designed for people in the first half of life; the New Testament, the message of Jesus is designed for those in the second half of life.

In the reading from Nehemiah, we see the people, who bowed down to receive this law, begin to weep gently. In a system where there the Law was the main emphasis, people ended up falling into two categories. These who were disciplined or strong enough to fulfill it and those who couldn't. Those who fulfilled the Law were the insiders. Those who could not fulfill the Law were the outcast.

Imagine the excitement of the people reared in the Old Testament system of outsiders and insiders as they listen to the message of Jesus! In this incredible message, no one is insignificant. Jesus tells the people that he has been touched by the spirit through this Baptism. He's inviting all people to be touched by that same spirit. Jesus says, "I've come to give you a message that will make you feel better". Jesus is going to bring a richness to our poverty, a sense of Freedom to the feeling of being imprisoned in weakness and half-truth. Jesus gives great value and dignity to each individual. This the joy found in Jesus's teaching. Jesus was very much in favor of life.

Life is our most precious gift, and it must be protected. It must be honored and nurtured always. Every time we fall into that terrible illusion and darkness of categorizing people as either valuable or disposable, we have lost the message Jesus came to put us in touch with. As we look at the ministry of Jesus, we find a man filled with spirit - not just the Law. If we believe and embody this spirit, we then become sources of light to all those we come in contact with.
