3rd Sunday of Lent

"He said to the gardener, "For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none."" Luke 13:7 We can all be like the barren fig tree at times. Do you cling to what you have, or do you generously share with others? How will you respond when God asks you what you have done with all of the gifts He has given you? Remember, not only are we called to be generous; we are called to develop and nurture our gifts; and return them with increase. We are called to be generous with all of gifts; especially the one that means the most to you.

SPIRITUAL INSIGHT— from Fr. Matthias Sule

Brothers and Sisters, as it's March 22nd - 23rd, 2025, we are about 3 weeks into our Lenten Journey, how far about the exercise: In the parable of the Fig Tree, the man goes on a search for fruit fullness. God is always looking for fruitfulness in this process of moving us along the journey that brings us in to new life. When we experience new life, that is a good sign that we are moving in the right direction on this journey. In the story, the vinedresser says that perhaps the fig tree needs to be cut down because it is not bearing fruit. God on the other hand is the one who says, "No, let's dig and probe and break things open. Let's put fertilizer around it to bring new life." God constantly offers grace. He constantly offers new life. He offers spiritual food and drink. There are, at least, two meaningful insights about God that come from the gospel of this Sunday: Firstly, our suffering and handicaps are not necessarily as a result of our sins, though suffering could be Pedagogical. That is, it teaches us something about human nature. Secondly, despite our own failures and indifferences, God always offers us a second chance. Our work as Christians is to become vinedressers ready to prune the fig tree in order to produce good fruits. We are called to be living examples to people walking in evil ways and prevailing to them not only by words but also our lifestyles. That they can repent. We cannot claim to be more righteous than other people and tend to judge others for their failings. Lent is a time to reconcile. To return to God. This explains the story of the fig tree being given another opportunity to bear fruit. God keeps giving us same opportunities, we must make use of it, repent and ask for forgiveness during this season of lent. Remember: "The key" to "the keys to the kingdom of Heaven": is the mercy of Jesus.
