DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Today, DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY, completes the nine-day prayerful digestion of the crucifixion, commemorated on Good Friday. While hanging on the cross, Jesus prayed to his Father to forgive all those who, because of their sins, he was crucified. On the merit of Jesus Christ who died on the cross, you and I are granted God's mercy. The experience of Christ's disciple locked behind the door reminds us of the pandemic lockdown experience, in both cases, all were afraid. We have all sinned and fallen short of God's glory. As sinners, we deserve condemnation and punishment as guilty. Hence, in justice, we are condemned, but in Mercy, we are saved. As such, Pope Saint John Paul II in the year 2001 designated the second Sunday of Easter to be celebrated as "Divine Mercy Sunday of Easter". Mercy is an act of kindness and forgiveness shown to someone who should have been punished for his offences. It's a kindness that one who has seen hurt shows to the one who hurt him. Mercy is the nature of God. God is mercy. The all merciful! And he demonstrates his mercy to the world when he sent his son in to the world, who died to save us from sin and death. The first Reading speaks about the new life of the redeemed, who experience the Love and mercy of God through Jesus Christ.
