

On this final Sunday before Palm Sunday and Holy Week, Christ looks at us as he looks at the woman caught in adultery, offering the forgiveness of our sins. Even if we are brought to shame before those of this world, we can have confidence in the mercy of Jesus, who will not condemn us. Because she did not run away, she gained "the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus" as her Lord. We accept the loss of all things, "considering them so much rubbish" compared to friendship with Jesus. We "remember not the events of the past"; we have a new life with Christ, we have "been taken possession of by Christ Jesus," who says to us, "Go, and from now on do not sin any more" (Magnificat, April 2025)
